



To ensure student and staff safety, BES will continue our buzzin system at the main doors of the building. All other entrances will be locked throughout the school day. Upon entrance, all visitors will be directed to the office front window.

Another safety policy BES will enforce is the drop-off and pick-up of students at the front entrance of the school. The curb lanes are for drop-off and pick-up only - no parking is allowed. Please DO NOT drop your student off in the middle lanes and allow them to cross traffic. If you wish to walk your student to the doors, you must park in the lot.

Drug and weapons free schools

--Students who violate this policy will be subjected to disciplinary action, in accordance with due process and as specified in the student handbooks, up to and including expulsion from school. When required by Michigan law, Blissfield Community Schools will also notify law enforcement officials.

Federal Entitlement Assurance

It is the policy of Blissfield Community Schools that no person shall, on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex or handicap, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination during any program or activity or in employment.

Insurance for Chromebooks and iPads

Beginning with iPads in first grade and Chromebooks in second grade the digital and online learning commitments in Blissfield Schools has been agressively established to level and enhance the learning opportunities across the district. The Apple and Dell products that have been selected for use are expected to finish a 4 to 5 rotation before reaching end of life. Best practices listed in the Device Handbook, found on our website, offer those steps which can protect these community investments.

Student Device Insurance

The Device Handbook also discusses an entry level insurance program which like all insurance is intended to shield families from sudden and heavy repair expenses from accidental damage and theft. Open enrollment for this insurance ends on September 9th. Forms are available online, in each school office or by request from tech@blissfieldschools.us. The policy costs \$35, not more than \$100 per family.

Pest Management program Advisory to all parents

As part of the Blissfield Community Schools district pest management program, it is our goal to reduce pesticides as much as possible. While it may be necessary to apply a pesticide, our program does **not** rely on routine pesticide application. You have the right to be informed prior to any pesticide application being made to the school buildings and grounds during the school year. In certain emergencies, (example: bee nests) pesticides may be applied without prior notice; however, you will be notified following any such application. You will receive advance notice of the application of a pesticide, other than bait or gel at your child's school. This advance notice of the application will be given 48 hours before the application. Blissfield Community Schools will post this notice at all entrances and the common areas located adjacent to the building office and on our school web page. Parents are also entitled to receive this notice by first-class United States mail postmarked at least 3 days before the application. If you would like to be notified by mail please contact:

School facility inspections

Public Act 628 requires the inspection of all school construction projects, including any building on district property. School projects which are being constructed, remodeled, or reconstructed are subject to inspections and plan review by the Michigan Bureau of Construction Codes and Fire Safety.

Therefore, all projects involving buildings and grounds must first be fully approved before any work is done. This includes, but is not limited, to the following: new construction, alterations of existing buildings on grounds, moving soil, locating fields, etc. Each specific request must be submitted in writing to the Director of Operations on a Buildings/Grounds Alteration Request Form available on the district website. The request must be accompanied by permits, applications, specifications, and any other information important to the project.

Student privacy and parent access to information

The Board will not allow the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information collected from students for the purpose of marketing or for selling that information.

Parents have the right to inspect, upon request, a survey or evaluation created by a third party before it is administered or distributed by the school to the student. Additionally, parents have the right to inspect, upon request, any instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum of the student. The parent will have access to any of the aforementioned materials within a reasonable time after the request is received by the building principal.

Bus routes published

Some delays in publishing bus routes is expected this year as schools in Lenawee county work to integrate information from the *Infinite Campus*TM platform with multiple district services and activities. Please note this important reminder: Transportation forms can be found on the school website or with the Infinite Campus registration pages from the online registration site. As

requests move through this new student information software, routes can be populated and planned. The transportation department endeavors to make each route as efficient as possible so that the children are transported in a safe and timely manner.

Bus drivers

Our district has recruited and employed more drivers over the summer months, but remains challenged in the number of available drivers for our bus fleet. This is not unusual for Michigan districts at this time, but our transportation team wants to be sure that we are reaching out in every direction with the message. Scott

Bus safety

When a school bus prepares to stop to load or unload children, the bus driver will activate flashing yellow lights. When motorists see these lights, all vehicles approaching the bus must slow down and prepare to stop. Once the bus stops, red stop lights will be activated and motorists must stop. Pay close attention to children who may be walking along the road, crossing the road, or waiting alongside the road. Watch for late students running toward the bus.

- Slow down and save a life
- Expect the unexpected
- Resist Distractions in school zones, in and around school buildings and bus stops
- Pay attention

- Remember all school buses stop at railroad tracks
- Be cautious when behind a school bus approaching railroad tracks
- Give the bus space

Motorists should remain stopped until the bus resumes motion, has deactivated its stop signal, and all passengers have cleared the roadway. Motorists should be prepared to react to unexpected movements of students waiting for the bus and getting off the bus. Children don't always follow standard pedestrian safety rules.

Feel free to contact the transportation department between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Food Service update

We are very grateful for the support to our food service program during the past two years from our students and staff. We will continue to serve healthy, fresh, good tasting meals and add more new options as they come available. Our district chose not to raise our meal prices, in fact, we are going back to 2019 prices.

Replenishing student meal accounts

The online tool for replenishing student meal accounts will not be ready by the start of school. Students may bring cash or checks to our food service until the Parent Portal tool is up and running.

Early applications for reduced pricing

Applications for free and reduced price meals are available throughout the school year at any of our school offices, via the Parent Portal (*Infinite Campus*) and online at www. lunchapplication.com We strongly encourage all families to complete the application before we start school to avoid any unpaid meal charges.

Food Services pricing

Effective for the 2022/2023 school year, the USDA waiver to provide free meals for all students has expired. This means breakfast and lunch charges to families will resume.

Breakfast Grades K-12 \$1.50

Infinite 8 oz. Milk Sold Separately \$.50

Campus Elementary Lunch \$2.85

Middle and High School Lunch \$3.10

Those who qualify for the free program will be able to get one breakfast and one lunch for free daily. Those students who qualify for reduced, will be charged .40 cents for breakfast and .40 cents for lunch.

Medications at school

Michigan law requires that new forms, available at each school office, be filled out by parent/guardian and the student's physician each year before school personnel may administer medication. The forms state the medication that is required, the exact dosage of the medication, and the time and dates medication should be taken.

All medication is stored and given to the child in the office. No medication, including aspirin, will be given to any student without the necessary forms. If you have any questions, please contact the office of the school your child attends.

Senior transition meetings

Grievance procedures

Any person believing that the Blissfield Community School district or any part of the school organization has inadequately applied the principles and/or regulations of (1) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, (2) Title IX of the Education Amendment Act of 1972, and (3) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, he/she may bring forward a complaint, which shall be referred to as a grievance, to the local Civil Rights Coordinator through the office of Mr. Mark Willson

Dual enrollment

The Michigan State Legislature passed **Public Act 160** of 1996, the **Postsecondary Enrollment Options Act** and **Public Act 258 of 2000**, the **Career and Technical Preparation Act** also known as the "Dual Enrollment" bills. These bills modify and expand on provisions of the State School Aid Act providing for students to earn college credit while in high school. The bills also require that the board of a school district or public school academy ensure that each student in eighth grade or higher be given information about college course taking opportunities.

The classes that students are eligible for must not be offered by the high school or academy and must lead towards postsecondary credit, accreditation, certification and/or licensing. If you have any questions, please contact Mr. Mark Willson.

The following date will be used to administer the optional SAT (without Essay) 10/13/22 for seniors interested in taking the make-up SAT test. Please note that this test does not contain the essay portion that the previous spring test had, and the test will not be free of charge like the previous spring test was. All seniors interested in taking the make-up SAT (without essay) must sign up and pay a \$60 registration fee in the CCC by Monday, 9/12/22.


NCAA Clearinghouse
